It was the SG who actually informed us that the ES had been involved in a motor accident the previous evening whilst returning to Abuja from Minna. The late ES was a humble gentleman.

Malam Danladi Ndayebo was a graduate of the Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria with vast field experience in Journalism and Public Relations. He was born on the 19th of January, 1975 in Minna but hailed from Gbako in Niger State. He attended Central Primary School, Minna, Day Secondary School, Minna & Govt. Science College, Wushishi between 1980 and 1992. He had a Post Graduate Diploma in Mass Communication from Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria in 2016 and a Masters in International Affairs and Diplomacy in 2022 from the same institution.

The late Danladi Ndayebo had between 2004 and 2008 held various editorial positions in Leadership Newspapers;
